


What Steps are Being Taken Regarding Health and Safety?



Daily Health Assessment

- Every student should complete the health screening checklist before leaving for school.
- This checklist can be found on page 8 of the "Return to School Handbook"



If a person exhibits COVID-19 symptoms during the school day:

- They will be isolated from others
- Parent/guardian transport home
- Parent/guardian contacts child's doctor



Those sent home with COVID-19 symptoms will need medical documentation/negative test results to return to school



What happens if someone tests positive?

- DOH is the lead agency
- They determine through contact tracing, who needs to be isolated/quarantined and for how long

What can shut us down (full remote)?

 9% positivity rate in the region OR lack of staff/faculty due to absenteeism

 Hallway signs, informational videos and presentations from admins and teachers will reinforce health and safety guidelines.



Face Coverings

Masks that cover the nose and mouth are required while:

- at the bus stop
- on the bus
- in the building

No gators, bandanas or scarves.



Face Coverings

- Masks may be removed while eating breakfast or lunch
- Teachers and staff will designate appropriate times for students to take "mask breaks" for a specified amount of time.



Common Spaces

 Social distancing will be encouraged whenever possible

Classrooms

- Classrooms have been set-up to maximize social distancing.
- There will be classrooms, during certain periods, where it is not possible to seat students exactly six feet apart.
- It is mandatory that students wear masks in all classroom settings at all times.

What About Wednesdays?



Wednesday: At Home Learning

- All students will be assigned a teacher in the building.
- Each student will do a virtual 30 minute check-in with this teacher every Wednesday morning
- Sometime between 8 and 9 am (will be specified soon)



Wednesday: At Home Learning

- Purpose:
 - Have a trusted adult to connect with
 - Kick-start the day.
- Students are expected to complete lessons or assignments that were provided by their teacher



What Does Instruction Look Like?



Instruction

- Two important terms:
 - Synchronous Learning: instructor and students are connected and working on the same lesson
 - Asynchronous Learning: instruction or lesson completion that does not occur at the same time



Instruction

 Teachers will use a combination of synchronous and asynchronous lessons plans to help students meet essential learning standards.

School Supplies

- Chromebook charged and ready to use everyday
- Headphones are encouraged
- Classroom teachers will tell students what is needed for their classes (switch to digital platform has changed what was previously requested)







School Supplies

- Limited shared supplies in classrooms
 - Students may stop by their grade level unit office if they need pens, paper or folders (*limited supply).



How Will Students Arrive and Dismiss from School?



Transportation



Transportation Guidelines:

- Masks Required on busses at all times
- Bus Capacity will be reduced by ½
- Seating choices will be limited
- Buses will be cleaned after every run
- Window/Hatches will be opened for improved ventilation



Transportation



- Late busses (3:30) will begin on Monday, September 21.
- These bus runs will be reserved for students enrolled in the Twilight afterschool program and PM WEMOCO students, and other approved after school activities.



Student Arrival to School

By bus	Exit the bus when dismissed and enter the building. Maintain social distancing.
Parent drop off prior to 7:35	Exit car in the front loop. Enter the building with face covering on. Maintain social distancing.
Parent drop off after 7:35	Exit car in the front loop. Enter the building with face covering on. Go directly to attendance desk to sign in.




Students will be admitted into the cafeteria by staff to get their breakfast and assigned a location to eat.



Student Dismissal from School

By bus	Students will be dismissed by bus number as they arrive. Dismissal announcements will start at 1:50. Exit the building & immediately board your bus.
Parent pick-up Prior to 2:05	An announcement will be made calling these students down. Exit the building and go directly to the car.
Walkers	Announcement will be made after buses are boarded
Parent pick-up after 2:05	Any students whose ride has yet to arrive will be directed to the cafeteria to wait.



Students will not be allowed to gather in front of the building.

How Will Breakfast and Lunch Work?



Breakfast & Lunch

- All students at Olympia now receive free breakfast and lunch (Community Eligibility Provision)
- Students will be provided with an ID/barcode that allows for touchless "purchase."



Breakfast

- Students may grab breakfast as they arrive at Olympia
- Cafeteria will be arranged to allow for social distancing
- Currently working on a plan to allow students to eat in teachers' classrooms beginning at 7:15



Lunch

- Three lunches are built into the schedule.
- Each lunch is 30 minutes
- There is 15 minutes between each lunch to allow for proper cleaning and set-up.



Meals for Students Learning-at-Home

- Five days a week, Olympia will offer take-home breakfast and lunch to students that are at home.
- Distribution details are still being finalized
- Must present an ID and it is only for students who attend Olympia.



What Extracurricular Opportunities are Available?



Extracurricular Activities

- No extracurricular activities at this time.
- State and local guidance regarding athletics and other approved school-based activities is updated regularly.
- Updates will be shared in the weekly Principal's newsletter.



What Supports Are Available for My Child?



Social Emotional Support

- Emotional well-being is our priority.
- Focus on the transition back to school the week of September 14.
- Universal screening survey given to all students the week of September 21.
- Each student will be assigned a staff member to check-in weekly.
- Wednesday check-ins to monitor student progress.
- Referrals for additional in-school and community resources.
